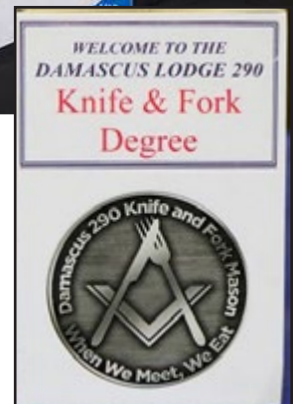

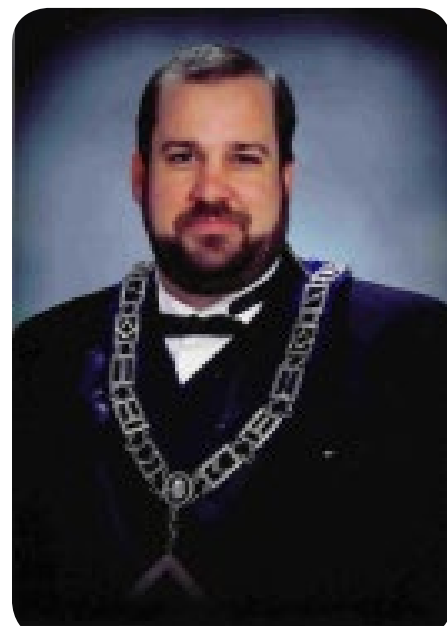
Are you a Traveling Man?

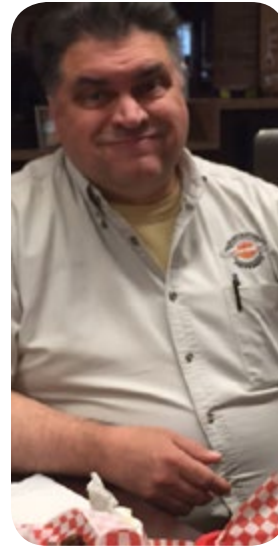
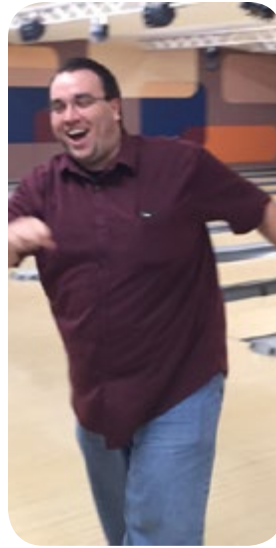
